South Arm Pool and Picnic Day – Tuesday, June 20th



We are looking forward to our annual **pool and picnic day!** Our school has two different swim times and classes will walk over to the pool in time for a picnic, safety talk and swim. Your child's teacher may have provided you with more detailed information specific to their class regarding changing, snacks, water bottles, sunscreen and more. Thank you for reading that

information carefully or speaking directly with your child's teacher if you have any questions.

We'd also like to provide some general information from the pool. **Students who are** <u>under 7 years</u> old must be in the water within arms reach of (very close to) an adult/caregiver. This will need to be the child's adult. Parents, teachers and staff will not be able to watch other children specifically as they will be supervising their own children/class. If your child is under 7 years old, please join them in the pool or understand that they will be able to enjoy the wading pool only.

If your child is <u>7 years or older</u>, they will be supervised by the lifeguards on duty. If they are not strong swimmers, we encourage you to be in the water with them or to have them stay in the shallow end only.

Thank you for understanding that your child's safety is very important to us and we will abide by the pool's safety rules.
