What is Black Excellence Day?

January 15th is in honour of the great civil rights leader, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. who was born on January 15, 1929.


The contributions of Black Canadians and the ongoing civil rights struggle of Black Canadians often go unacknowledged in our history books and school curriculum.

The term Black Excellence was born out of the civil rights movement in the 1960s.

January 17th is Raoul Wallenberg Day

At times like these, the evil in the world can feel overwhelming and it can be tempting to cede to despair, aggravating the problem of the international community as a bystander to atrocity and injustice. How appropriate, then, that January 17 – the day of Raoul Wallenberg's disappearance in the Soviet Gulag in 1945 – has been designated Raoul Wallenberg Commemorative Day in Canada in honour of this disappeared hero. Wallenberg rescued some 100,000 Jews in six months in Hungary in 1944, demonstrating that **one person with the courage to care, and the commitment to act, can confront evil and transform history.**

Get REDI Reconciliation, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion with Richmond School District

A webinar series on Zoom for parents and caregivers to understand and support SD38 initiatives around inclusion and belonging.

This initial 60-minute session is designed to help you understand the district's commitment to reconciliation, equity, diversity and inclusion, and the values and language that inform our practices in schools. The facilitator, Destine Lord,



will draw on the district's strategic plan to drive the conversation and make connections between the plan, the district's vision, and introductory concepts of anti-oppression. By building the language, you can help support your learner as they move between home and school and back again. There will be opportunities with future sessions to further explore REDI concepts.



Destine Lord (she/her) is a consultant and facilitator actively working towards the elimination of racism in Canada. For the last 15 years, she has worked in both the private and public sectors, facilitating workshops and training sessions related to anti-racism,


