Morning School Entry

What is changing: The doors will automatically unlock at the 8:40am bell and remain unlocked until 8:50am. If your child arrives after the class has entered but before 8:50am, they should enter through their assigned door and proceed to their classroom. If you arrive at 8:50am, please enter through the front door and sign in on the late sign in sheet under your child's division.

What will be the same: Students will continue to line up at their entrance and follow the instructions from their teacher. Students will enter the school and head to their classrooms.

Why are we changing: Right now teachers are waiting at these doors to make sure everyone gets inside. These teachers will now be assisting students in their classrooms instead of holding the door. It will also reduce the number of students that line up to sign in when they arrive shortly after 8:40am.



Rain or Shine

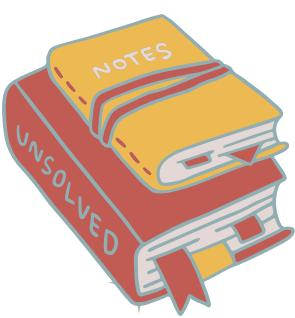

Orange Shirt Day at Bridge

Orange Shirt Day takes its name from Phyllis Webstad, a Northern Secwepemc (Shuswap) woman from the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation, whose orange shirt was taken on her first day at residential school – a shirt that now symbolizes how the residential school system took away not only Indigenous students' clothing, but also their language, culture, and families. This day reminds us of the resilience and strength of Indigenous peoples, and of our shared responsibility to honor the children who attended residential schools, remember those who did not return home, and support the survivors and their families who continue to carry these experiences.

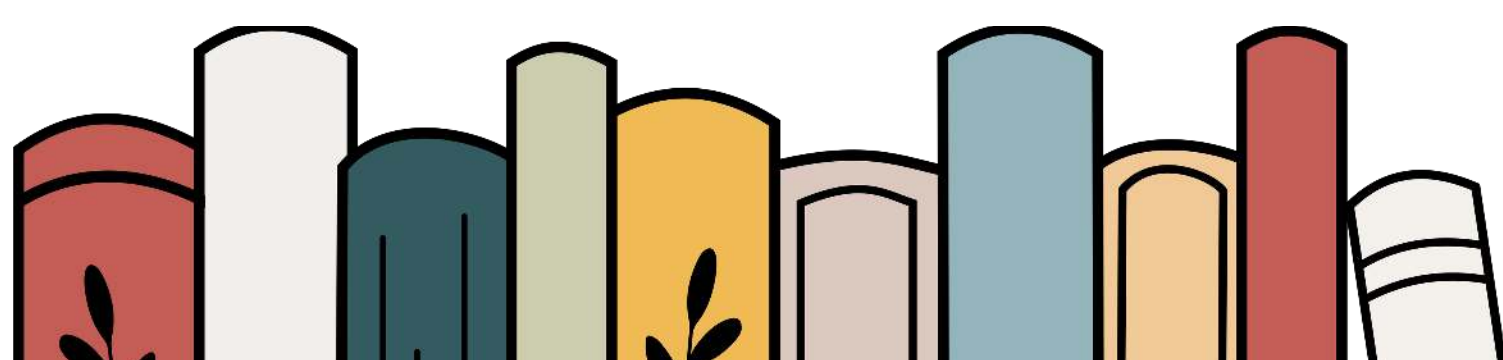

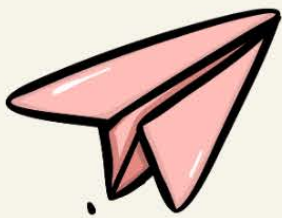
