#### **Orange Shirt Day**

September 30th has been declared <u>Orange Shirt Day</u> annually, in recognition of the harm the residential school system did to children's sense of self-esteem and well-being, and as an affirmation of our commitment to ensure that everyone around us matters. With schools being closed for the <u>National Day of</u>

<u>Truth and Reconciliation</u> on September 30<sup>th</sup>, students and staff are welcome and invited to wear orange on September 29<sup>th</sup> or any day of the year. The annual Orange Shirt Day on September 30th opens the door to global conversation on all aspects of Residential Schools. It is an opportunity to create meaningful discussion about the effects of Residential Schools and the legacy they have left behind. A discussion all Canadians can tune into and create bridges with each other for reconciliation. A day for survivors to be reaffirmed that they matter.

## **Parking Lot Safety**

To keep our children safe when arriving and leaving school, we ask you to respect the traffic signs and rules in our school's parking lots and on the road. As the signs indicate, our parking lot is reserved for **STAFF PARKING ONLY**.

We do not have parking spaces for families and ask for your cooperation to:

- Park on the road in the neighbourhood and walk to the school, or
- 2. Use our **drop-off lane** to park, stay in your vehicle, let your child out of the car, and continue through the lane.

Here are some tips for drivers, pedestrians and parents from ICBC to make travelling to and from school safe for everyone.

**Stick to the Speed Limit** ~ A 30 km/h speed limit is in effect in school zones from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. every school day, unless otherwise posted. In playground zones, a 30 km/h speed limit is in effect every day from dawn to dusk.

<u>Scan Crosswalks and Intersections from Left to Right as You Approach</u> ~ Watch for pedestrians waiting to cross, especially during school hours.

**Leave Your Phone Alone** ~ Distraction is the leading factor for drivers in crashes involving pedestrians and cyclists.

**Notice if Other Drivers are Slowing Down or Stopping** ~ If a vehicle is stopped in front of you or in the lane next to you, they may be yielding to a pedestrian, so proceed with caution and be prepared to stop.

<u>Give Yourself Enough Stopping Distance</u> ~ You need more time to stop when you're driving fast. At a slower speed, motorists have a better chance to react when children or others are crossing the road. This could be the difference that saves a life.

<u>Watch for School Buses</u> ~ When their lights are flashing, vehicles approaching from both directions must stop.

<u>Cross Only at Marked or Controlled Crosswalks</u> ~ Do not jaywalk or cross when it isn't your turn.

**Look Both Ways Before Crossing the Street** ~ Ensure it is safe to cross from both directions of traffic before setting foot on the crosswalk.

Make Eye Contact with Drivers Approaching the Crosswalk ~ Be certain they see you and that they've committed to slowing down to a stop.

<u>Let Your Child Enter and Exit Your Car on the Side Closest to the Sidewalk</u> ~ It's safest to drop off and pick up as close to the sidewalk as possible. Do not allow your child to cross mid-block.

<u>Before Starting Your Car, Check for Small Children Hidden From Your View</u> ~ Walk around your car and always look carefully for pedestrians when backing up.
