Halloween offers an opportunity to have meaningful conversations about costume choices with students and adults and requires consideration. It is important to keep in mind that we need to be sensitive to groups that have been marginalized through mimicry and cultural appropriation during Halloween and other 'dress up' events.

#### It's good to keep in mind that the following are NOT costumes:

RACE (black face/brown face)

**CULTURE** (Indigenous regalia/dreadlocks)

RELIGIOUS FAITH (religious figures/gods/saints/gurus/hijab)

**GENDER** (gender switching for humour or to mock)

TRAUMA (hangman's noose/weapons)

#### **Musqueam Day**

An important day recognized by Musqueam Nation to celebrate their ancestor's determination to seek justice and protect their inherent rights. On November 1, 1984, Musqueam won Guerin v. The Queen, the landmark Supreme Court of Canada case regarding the Shaughnessy Golf Course lease. The case, led by Musqueam Chief Delbert Guerin, fundamentally changed Canadian law.

These children will begin Kindergarten in September 2024. Online registration opens on November 1, 2023. Please visit our website <a href="https://www.sd38.bc.ca/kindergarten">www.sd38.bc.ca/kindergarten</a> for more information about our online registration process, required documents, important dates, and FAQs.

We encourage families to complete their registration within the Priority 1 registration window, which spans from **November to January**, in order to maximize their chances of securing a spot at their catchment school. All registration applications received any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions by February 2, 2024.

Videos detailing Kindergarten registration have been made available on our District website, providing new parents with guidance on the registration process, English Language Learner (ELL) assessments, and District Program Options (Early French Immersion and Montessori).
