#### Administration Report - Colleen O & Eleanor L

- Land Acknowledgement
- Staffing: One EA position to be filled; hiring expected by next week.
- **Enrollment:** 355 students 7 English divisions and 8 French divisions.
- Meet the Teacher Night: Well attended; positive feedback from parents.
- Terry Fox Run: Raised over \$2,000 for cancer research.
- Numeracy Pro-D: Held at Bridge with participation from three district schools.
- Volleyball: Season starting soon.
- **Photo Day:** Coming up shortly.
- Orange Shirt Day: Monday; stickers provided for all students.
- **Family Teams:** Begin next week students from all grades grouped together for activities throughout the year.

- FSAs (Foundational Skills Assessments): Upcoming for Grade 4 and 7 students; standardized provincial assessment in literacy and numeracy.
- **Grade 7 Hoodies:** Classes voting on designs; Eleanor will ensure all students have input. Target delivery: mid-November.
- Outdoor Education (Camp):

## Treasurer's Report - Angeline N

Angeline reviewed the treasurer's role and provided a financial update:

• **Gaming Grant:** \$578

• General Account: \$28,377

#### Notes:

- Gaming Grant applications are due before the end of each school year.
- Gaming funds must be used within three years and cannot be used for curriculum-based items.
- General funds come from fundraisers such as hot lunches, Spring Fair, Halloween Dance, Freezie Days, and Sports Day concession.
- PAC supports family assistance, Grade 7 graduation, school events, and presentations.

## f. Teacher Budgets

- Resource, EAs, music, and library staff will also receive additional support via the school wish list.
